WE ARE WESTERVILLE



Established in 1951, the Westerville Youth Baseball and Softball League has a long and proud tradition serving our community. Whether you're a returning player or new to our community or league, welcome to our 2014 season!

What makes us special is who we are – a community-based, non-profit, all volunteer recreational sports league. And it's important to understand what that means when deciding who you will trust your young players with, where your fees go and hopefully where you will consider volunteering your time!

<u>Community-based</u> – together with our partners, the City of Westerville and the Westerville City Schools, we have strategically planned the construction, maintenance and enhancement of all of the fields used in our program. This includes WYBSL funding exceeding \$600,000 over the last 10 years to provide arguably some of the best fields in the region – with more improvements coming!

Non-profit – each year, the Trustees strive to operate on a break-even budget. Registration fees are intended to cover operating costs (uniforms, balls, bats, etc.) while our only player fund-raising activity (raffle tickets) and 100% of proceeds from concession services go to our Fields Fund that are allocated back to field and facility projects. Unlike "for profit" programs we invest all of your fees into building our program and community.

<u>All Volunteer</u> – our goal is to cultivate a pride of ownership in the program because without it, the program cannot flourish. There is room for everyone who has a little or a lot of time to help out – just send us a note and we will put you on our "roster".

<u>Recreational</u> – our policies and operations foster opportunity for all players as well as a focus on sportsmanship and respect. Yes, there is competition, but providing a memorable season with new and old friends while improving athletic skills and learning life lessons is our goal.

In this newsletter you will find information regarding our spring program including registration forms to get you started. Lastly, check our website throughout the season for updates, schedules and events of our program.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON CONCUSSIONS

Concussions are a serious concern in all youth sports. In Ohio, the law requires the league to insure all coaches and umpires complete designated training as well as provide information to all parents. Concussion training is free and can be done online. SPRING/SUMMER PROGRAM REGISTRATION

Young people wishing to play in our WYBSL 2014 Spring/ Summer program may register in four ways:

- Last year's players should receive a personalized application inserted within this newsletter – please mail it to the League with your fees.
- At one of our walk-in registration sessions that will be held at Westerville Senior Center (310 W. Main St.) on any of three Saturdays (March 1, March 8 and March 15) anytime between 10:00AM and 1:00PM.
- By completing the applicable form(s) on pages 9-12 of this newsletter and mailing forms and fees to WYBSL.
- By downloading a registration packet from our website and mailing forms and fees to WYBSL.

If a player did not play in the WYBSL during the 2013 Spring/Summer or Fall Ball seasons, please bring or send a non-returnable copy of the player's birth certificate.

At right is a quick age reference chart for all of the WYBSL Baseball, Softball and Tee-Ball leagues. The playing age is the boy or girl's age on April 30, 2014.



WHERE DO YOUR FEES GO?

The WYBSL is a non-profit organization and strives to "break-even" each year and then adjust fees accordingly to achieve this goal. In 2013, total league expenses were over \$250,000 and League Trustees pride themselves on proper stewardship of all fees.

In one area, WYBSL collects more than \$40,000 in Fields Fund fees — and 100% of your \$24 fee are placed in this fund. This fund is used for field maintenance, improvements, new fields and special projects. A summary of estimated 2014 expenses is shown at right.



GROWING UP IN THE WYBSL!

Our league offers young boys and girls the opportunity to spend many years in our program. Although skills and competition increase as players advance through the system, the focus at all levels is on learning, playing and fun. Continuous batting orders are used and all players must play a minimum number of innings in the field. And, although we base our rules on National Federation of High School standards, there are modifications for each league to provide a careful evolution and recreational focus as summarized below:

Tee-Ball	No scores or standings are kept, ten players bat each inning regardless of outs and ten defensive players with coaches in the field for instruction.
Coach-Pitch	Coaches pitch to their own team, scores and standings are kept but not emphasized, batters receive up to 7 pitches but there are no walks. Ten fielders are used with coaches teaching from the field and fielders must play 3 innings & must play infield and outfield.
Green Hat	Players are pitching, bunting and stealing (see specific rules). Baseball teams begin draft selection process and play with 9 players in the field.
Red Hat	Competition increases but focus on instruction continues. Stealing of all bases is allowed and dropped 3rd strike is introduced. Limited balk rules in baseball.
Blue Hat	Generally a middle school age league, certified OHSAA umpires are used, pitchers can pitch complete games. In baseball, field size increases substantially and lead-offs are allowed.
Black Hat	For baseball, generally high school young men playing on "major league" field size. Eighteen year olds must be in high school at registration.

PLAYING UP FROM YOUR NORMAL AGE ★ ★ MANDATORY ASSESSMENT ★ ★

A player's "Playing Age" is his/her age on April 30, 2014, and we urge parents and guardians to consider that children play in the normal league for their age.

But we realize that there are some reasons for "playing up" to an older league – such as skill level, wishes to play with siblings, etc. – and WYBSL provides a way for boys and girls to do so – at their parent's request and with the approval of the WYBSL. <u>Assessment attendance is a mandatory criterion</u>.

For **GIRLS** with Playing Ages of 6, 8, 10 or 12, and For **BOYS** with Playing Ages of 6, 7, 8, 10 or 12,

- A parent or guardian must submit a Play-Up Form (found on page 11) with the player's application.
- After regular registration ends, space must be open.
- Players will be considered in the chronological order in which their forms and fees are received.
- The player MUST either:
 - 1. Have played in the <u>same</u> higher age division before (2013 Spring/Summer or Fall season), or
 - Attend a mandatory play-up assessment session on Saturday, March 29th (see note below) or April 5th. Times and locations for each age group are listed in the calendar on page 18.
- WYBSL staff must agree that the player is able to safely and competitively play at the requested level.

If the player does not meet the above criteria, or if the staff does not believe that the player can safely and competitively play at the requested level, the parents will be contacted and given the option of playing at the normal age level, if space is available.

Note: March 29th play-up assessment – this session is intended for those who cannot attend the April 5th session. However, players in Boys' Green, Red, Blue and Black Hat leagues who attend this session will be assigned to teams and not eligible to be drafted. Please only attend this session if you cannot attend on April 5th.

The WYBSL reserves the right to re-evaluate a play-up participant at any time, before or during the season, and take appropriate action to ensure the safety of all participants.

HOW ARE TEAMS SELECTED

Team selection is a very time-consuming task for your League administrators. Regardless of the age group involved - in all leagues, the first players to be assigned are:

- Sons/Daughters of Head and Assistant Coaches
- Returning players in the same league as last year, unless they ask to be reassigned, or in our girls' leagues if their "play with a friend" request causes a reassignment
- Siblings in the same league are automatically placed on the same team, unless otherwise requested
- Balance the Playing Ages on each team, so that no team has a disproportionate number of older or younger players (but no continuing team is penalized because all potential returning players wish to return to their team)

Requests for specific coaches or "car pooling" groups unfortunately cannot be honored.

In Boys' Black Hat, Blue Hat, Red Hat and Green Hat leagues, players are selected in a "skill assessment" and "draft" procedure. If a player is new to a league or wishes to play on a different team than last spring, he/she should go to the Skill Assessment Session listed for the appropriate league in the WYBSL calendar on page 18. Coaches then participate in a Player Draft to balance Playing Ages and perceived skills. At the end of this draft, any players who could not attend their skill assessment session are assigned to teams using a "blind draw" or "age and alphabet" assignment.

In Girls' Blue Hat, Red Hat, and Green Hat leagues, players should attend the appropriate Skill Assessment (see calendar on page 18). These are used to help the league staff assign girls to teams by balancing skill level, age, pitchers and catchers while honoring "play with a friend" requests. In Girls' Tee-Ball and Coach-Pitch, teams are selected by General Managers based upon "play with a friend" requests and neighborhood.

In Boys' Tee-Ball and Coach-Pitch leagues, remaining players are assigned to teams by General Managers. Players are grouped together by neighborhood, although some teams might be composed of multiple neighborhoods and some neighborhoods may be divided. Play with a friend requests unfortunately cannot be honored in these leagues.

WHAT'S SUPPLIED – AND WHAT SHOULD WE BUY?

At all levels, the league supplies all <u>team</u> equipment necessary to play the game – bases, balls, helmets, bats, batting tee (tee-ball) and catcher's gear (coach-pitch and older). WYBSL also provides each player with a team shirt and cap or visor, which the player may keep. Each player must supply a fielder's glove, shoes and shorts or baseball pants (required for boys at the Green Hat level and older). Your coach will probably ask that all players wear the same color of shorts or baseball pants. If possible, please follow the request of the coach. Optional items, such as heart protectors or special masks, are not required and, if chosen, are the family's responsibility.



IF WE BUY A BAT ... WHAT KIND SHOULD IT BE?

One of the most distressing things that a parent or player can be told is that a personal bat can't be used because it is "illegal" – especially after it was just purchased last year! In order to avoid costly mistakes, here are some simple guidelines (generally for safety):

- In Tee-Ball, the bats must be factory-marked "Tee-Ball"

 or "Little League" (boys) or "Softball" (girls).
- 2. In Girls Coach-Pitch, bats must be factory marked "Softball".
- 3. In all other Girls' softball leagues, bats must be factory-marked "2000 or 2004 ASA".
- 4. In Boys' Coach-Pitch, Green Hat and Red Hat, the bats must be factory-marked "Little League"

A bat that is factory-marked "Tee-Ball" can only be used in our Tee-Ball leagues. A boy's bat that is factory-marked "Little League" can be used from Tee-Ball through Red Hat; commencing with the 2015 Spring Season all boys baseball bats factory-marked with "Little League" must also be factory-marked "1.15 BPF." A girl's bat that is factory-marked "2000 or 2004 ASA" can be used throughout the softball leagues.

- 5. When a boy plays Blue Hat or Black Hat ball, NFHS rules apply with one Blue Hat modification:
 - A non-wood bat must be 2⁵/₈" or less in diameter, 36" or less in length, with a -3 differential between length and weight. The BBCOR standard will also apply. Current and new NFHS bat rules can be found at www.nfhs.org.
 - In Blue Hat only, a non-wood bat less than 32" in length may be 2%" in diameter and have a -5 length to weight differential and must be factory marked with the appropriate "1.15 BPF" label.

Most problems occur when Boys' Red Hat players graduate to Blue Hat. Many expensive bats can't be used - so when buying a bat for your older boys, please buy carefully. And, call the league if you have questions.



GLOVES, SHOES & "CUPS"

We suggest a generic infielder or outfielder glove be your first purchase. Most importantly, make sure it is the right size for your player! In older baseball leagues, pitcher's gloves cannot include white or gray. Softball gloves cannot be optic in color.

For our Tee-Ball and Coach-Pitch leagues, gym shoes or baseball/softball shoes are fine. As players grow, we recommend baseball/softball shoes. Also, metal spikes are not allowed except in the Boys' Blue & Black Hat leagues.

We strongly suggest that parents consider that all boys wear cups for protection as they grow in the program. Catchers at Green Hat and older levels must wear one.

★ ★ REFUND POLICY ★ ★

Although we expect every registered child to play in the WYBSL, we know that some unforeseen circumstances do arise that might cause a player to withdraw from the League.

In order to request a refund, a parent or guardian <u>must</u> send an e-mail message to the League at **wybsl@wybsl.org**. Please use the word "Refund" in the subject line and report the:

- 1. Date
- 3. Player's league
- 2. Player's name
- 4. Reason for withdrawal

All refunds will be made by WYBSL check, regardless of the method of registration payment.

A refund will be processed within four weeks after the request, if the refund is reported before May 1.

- If reported by March 31, a full refund will be given.
- If reported by April 30, a \$25 processing fee will be charged
- If reported on or after May 1, there shall be no refund.

WHAT TO DO IN BAD WEATHER

The safety of our players and damage to fields that might affect future games should be primary concerns of all WYBSL participants. Below is the Weather Policy:

Rain — Prior to a scheduled game, only the WYBSL Fields Director (or other WYBSL designee) has the authority to cancel a game. If timing is possible, the league will announce the day's field conditions on the Weather Hot Line (614) 523-6220 and Twitter page @WYBSLalerts. However, if conditions are marginal – or if rain occurs after one and one-half hours before game time, teams should go to their field. At that point, and throughout the game, the authority to stop play rests with the umpires and WYBSL staff. Games may be resumed at any time within 30 minutes of stoppage, if fields are playable.

Lightning — If the City's Lightning Prediction System covers a field of play, when there is the possibility of lightning, one continuous horn burst is sounded and all games and practices must stop and fields will be cleared. An all-clear is signaled by three short bursts.

Whether a lightning prediction system is present or not, if lightning is sighted, umpires will immediately clear the field and dugout; if sighted by one umpire in a multiple diamond location, all fields will be cleared. Games may resume no less than 20 minutes after the last lightning sighting, if fields are playable.

Playability — If a game is stopped during play, players and fans should move to shelter or cars and wait for a notice from the umpire or WYBSL staff. The final decision regarding playability rests with the umpires (in a multiple diamond location, umpires may consult each other if field conditions are marginal).

In the case of practices, Head Coaches are responsible for following the weather policy. For all Coach-Pitch and Tee-Ball games, Head Coaches are jointly responsible for following league policy.

Make-Ups — If a game cannot be played or completed, your General Manager will reschedule it as soon as possible, with final confirmation by your Umpire Coordinator. Usually, your make-ups for the week will be played on Saturday (at any time) or on Sunday afternoon. And, once scheduled – the make-up game will be played or considered a forfeit.

SPRING/SUMMER SPECIAL EVENTS

Skills Clinics — In past years, Varsity Softball and Baseball Coaches from Westerville High Schools and Otterbein University have worked with us to conduct clinics for players and coaches. Check our website or ask your coach for scheduling information once practices begin.



First Pitch Celebration — join us on May 10th as we start our season with a special event at Huber Village Park! Bring the family, have a hot dog and enjoy the activities that include:

- <u>Team Photo Day</u> your coach will have your scheduled time and order forms for team and individual photos. Rain date is May 17th.
- MLB Pitch, Hit & Run WYBSL hosts the Westerville qualifier for girls and boys ages 7-14 (as of July 17th) and it's free.
- Obstacle Course & Bounce House great fun for our young players and their siblings!
- <u>Food Drive</u> help those in need by bringing a small donation.

Independence Day Parade — March with us in the annual Westerville Parade on July 4th! Organize your team or volunteer to help the league create a special entry!

All Star Saturday — Our annual tradition continues this year on July 5th (rain date July 6th) at Huber Village and Highlands Parks. Cheer on the teams and watch the Home Run Derbies for Green Hat and older Leagues.



UMPIRES

The WYBSL schedules over 1,300 games each season using the following classification of Umpires by league level:

Green and Red Hat: The Umpire Director schedules WYBSL trained and paid umpires. Upon completion of required training/evaluation, compensation varies by experience and can be a great first job for high school students age 15 and above. Training will be held April 26th and May 3rd.

<u>Blue and Black Hat:</u> OSHAA Certified umpires are used to officiate all games at this level.

All umpires must complete concussion training. Contact Tommy Abbott at umpires@wybsl.org or sign-up during Walk-In Registration dates.

<u>Tee-Ball and Coach-Pitch:</u> Adult volunteers are asked to count pitches, call foul balls and safe/out at bases. Please speak to your coach to help out!

We need everyone's help to make sure that the WYBSL experience is a great one for all players. Please direct your "enthusiasm" toward positive encouragement.



TURN IN YOUR RAFFLE TICKET STUBS

After practices start, your coach will distribute raffle tickets to each registered player. Each player receives a bundle of 12 tickets which were paid for as part of his/her registration. This is WYBSL's only fundraiser and proceeds go into our Special Fields Fund for maintenance, renovation and construction of facilities and playing fields.

Players can sell each ticket for \$2 each and keep the proceeds to offset the fee paid to the league or put their name on the tickets. Either way, be sure to turn the tickets in to your coach or at a concession trailer by June 28 – and don't forget to pull the staple out!

Winning tickets will be drawn on All-Star Saturday at Huber Village Park and you don't have to be there to win!

WYBSL CONDUCT RULE

Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated in the league. Team coaches are responsible for their conduct and the conduct of their players and fans. A coach, player or fan can be ejected from a game and/or removed from the playing field area by order of an umpire, General Manager, Commissioner or Program Director if they violate a league rule of conduct, as follows:

- A. In a game, no coach may utilize any player(s) not currently assigned to his/her team roster by the League. Violation of this rule will result in automatic permanent suspension of the coach(es) involved.
- B. No coach, player or fan shall ever engage in a physical altercation with any player, umpire, coach or fan.
- C. No coach, player or fan shall intentionally violate or refuse to follow any league or game rules.
- D. No coach, player, umpire or fan shall come to the playing field under the influence of alcohol or an illegal drug; and no coach, player or umpire shall use tobacco products at the playing field during a game or practice.
- E. No coach, player or fan shall engage in grossly unsportsmanlike conduct, including, but not limited to, throwing equipment, use of profanity, arguing with an umpire over a call or directing remarks to a player, umpire, coach or fan which are of a degrading or distracting nature.
- F. Only the Head Coach, or his/her designee in the Head Coach's absence, may leave his/her designated area to dispute a judgment call by an umpire. This infraction may be penalized by either restricting to the dugout for the remainder of the game or ejecting the Head Coach and/or the offending coach.
- G. After each game, in the practice of good sportsmanship, <u>all</u> coaches and players shall form two opposing lines and proceed through a traditional, orderly "handshake line". No coach or player shall avoid participation in this line or exhibit unsportsmanlike conduct in the line.
- H. No coach, player, parent or fan shall, at any time, threaten, intimidate, attempt to intimidate, harm or attempt to harm, any umpire, player, coach, WYBSL official or fan. Any person who violates this rule may immediately be banned from all WYBSL sites and activities for a period of time to be determined by the Board of Trustees, up to and including a permanent ban. This rule shall be applied regardless of where and when the offending conduct takes place.

If a coach, player or fan is ejected from a game and/or removed from the playing field area for conduct as described above (or in the case of G. above, does not participate as described), the person shall provide a written statement describing his/her version of the events and/or other explanation to the General Manager within twenty-four hours of the incident, and may not attend or participate in any practice or game until doing so.

The General Manager and Commissioner or Program Director shall review the statement and gather any other information from other parties that they deem necessary to determine if a further penalty should be assessed. Such further penalty, if any, shall be assessed before the team's next scheduled game.

Any coach who violates the above guidelines may be immediately removed from his/her position by his/her Commissioner, GM or Program Director. In the event of such an occurrence, each coach would be provided with the opportunity to appear before the Board of Trustees at its next scheduled meeting in order to describe for the Board his/her version of the events which may exist for reinstating the coach.

2014 FALL BALL

Fall Ball is a big part of our program. In 1996, our girls' softball program conducted a test Fall Ball league for girls – and in 1997, the boys' baseball program also added Fall Ball leagues. We have expanded the program each year – and last year, more than 900 young people played on 75 teams in 12 leagues for girls (4-15) and boys (4-17).

Fall Ball in the WYBSL blends spring/summer season veterans with new players, those of other leagues, and local "travel teams" – and is a great way to prepare young people who will be moving up to the next level of play in the spring or begin play in our youngest leagues. Our emphasis is on learning and geared to fun.

Spring players should receive mail registration materials in late June; our 2014 Fall Ball walk-in Registration Sessions will be held on Saturdays, July 12 and 19 at the Westerville City Building at 64 E. Walnut Street from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM.

CONDITIONING FOR YOUR SPORT

Many injuries sustained by young athletes playing organized sports can be avoided if the athlete is properly conditioned. Remember, being physically fit for one sport or position does not mean an athlete is prepared for another. Below are 10 Principles of Conditioning:

- Warm up/cool down- A light jog or swimming a few easy laps gets blood flowing into the muscles to warm them up. It is easier to stretch a warm muscle than a cold muscle. After warming up, stretch the appropriate muscle groups, perform the activity, and then cool down with stretching.
- **2. Motivation** coaches should be creative with workouts and practices to keep the athlete interested. Training is allowed to be fun!
- 3. Overload- work harder than normal to place a stress on your body, within limits, and your body will adapt and improve to those levels as long as they are not too difficult.
- **4. Consistency** workouts must have a regular set schedule to be effective.
- **5. Progression** like overload, increase the intensity of a workout (more reps or weight) gradually over a period of time.
- **6. Intensity** work hard for shorter periods of time, rather than for longer periods of time.
- **7. Specificity** drills should match the skill the athlete requires for the sport.
- Individuality- every athlete will need individual attention.
- **9. Minimize stress** give them time to rest during the week (at least one to two days off).
- **10. Safety** make sure where the athlete is training is safe and teach proper technique.

Consult your primary care physician for more serious injuries that do not respond to basic first aid. As an added resource, the staff at Nationwide Children's Hospital Sports Medicine is available to diagnose and treat sports-related injuries for youth or adolescent athletes. Services are now available in five locations. To make an appointment, call (614) 355-6000 or request an appointment online.


